Ask to see before and after photos of the dentist's work. Make sure you read testimonials and know these pictures are of actual patients.

Does the dentist regularly perform smile makeovers? Remember, there is no substitute for experience.

Does the dentist use diagnostics such as imaging, mock-ups, wax-ups, and prototype to determine what the patient wants? Just as important, does this take place before the final porcelain work begins? This assures you'll be happy with the final results.

Does the dentist use current technology such as the Biolase MD laser, laser cavity detectors, imaging, and intraoral photography? These technologies can contribute to excellent results.

Do you feel comfortable, have rapport, and feel like you get personal attention from the dentist and staff? Communication is important, as cosmetic dentistry is a very personal and customized field.

Does the dentist offer oral sedation? This service can make long appointments much more comfortable.
